Bird Point Counts:

First, learn to identify common bird species in your garden. Maculay Library, the world's largest archive of bird sound: www.birds.cornell.edu/MacaulayLibrary

Procedure:

Select an observation post in your garden. Use the same post for the entire study. Conduct 1-2 counts per week during May, June over a 6-week period if you want to connect birds with arthropod populations. Time your counts (ideally) during the period between 6 AM and 9 AM.

Make observations over a 10-minute period on each day, wait 10 minutes before beginning so birds adjust. Avoid poor weather (i.e. temperatures $< 50^{\circ}$ F, rain, high winds). Record your observations on this tally sheet
